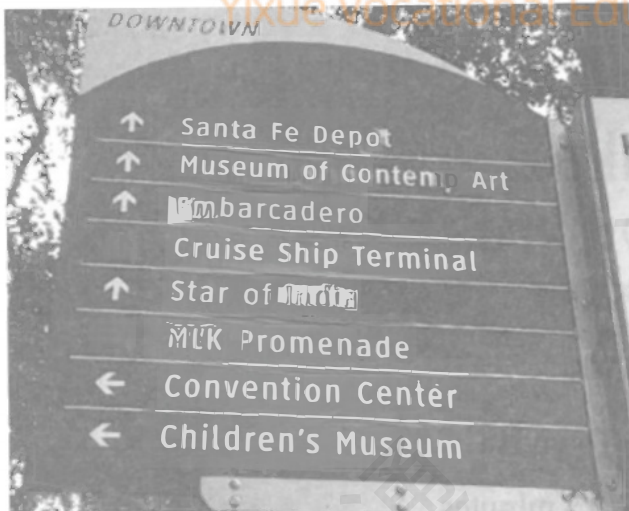

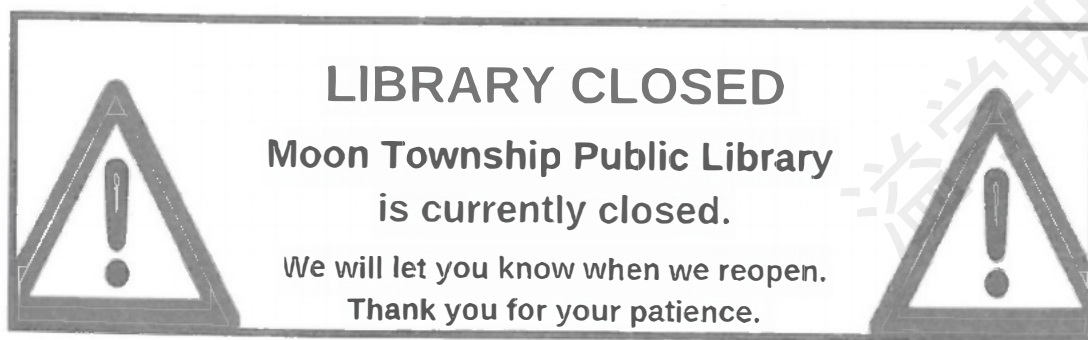

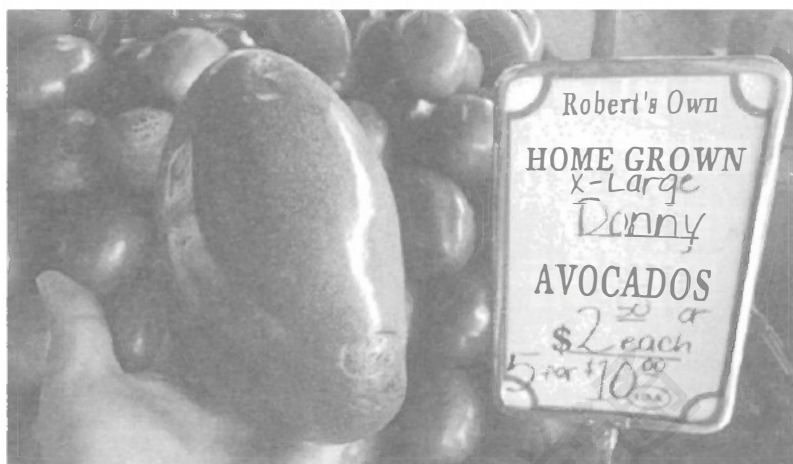

The organization of our housing can be a mirror of our cultural requirements for space. British culture, for example, separates different uses so that people have the kitchen for cooking in, the dining room for eating in and the bedroom for sleeping in. They're very protective of individual spaces and love to have their own bedrooms, their own chairs and their own secret drawers. This is very different in other cultures.

Jamaican houses usually have a big back yard and a front garden. People play a lot outside — more outside than inside. It is almost as if the whole neighborhood was their house or their home, so to speak—they have a big family and they are always into each other's spaces — it is never private.

Arabs don't have much space in public but they love to have big spaces inside their houses. They have large empty rooms with not much furniture because they don't like to be alone — they like to be with each other inside these big spaces.

The Japanese, on the other hand, don't have much physical space — they have very small apartments and houses. But what they do with the space is very clever. The spaces are multifunctional. So during the day they'll have a sitting room where at night they'll remove all the furniture and it becomes a bedroom. The typical Japanese

house is basically one big room — could be the dining area, the living area, the place they entertain (招待) guests and then could be the guestroom or even the bedroom. The old generation hardly really had their own room when they were children — they shared the room, they always stayed with their parents. Parents knew everything.

Zuogong County is located in southeastern Xizang, China. The whole county has only one middle school, Zuogong County Middle School.

Su Xin is the headmaster of the school. He is from Liangshan, Sichuan Province. His wife, Gan Runmei is also from Sichuan. She is now an English teacher at the school. They both came to Xizang to teach after graduating from university in 2001. In 21 years, the school has changed a lot.

When they first came to the school, over a hundred students could only speak Xizang. Su Xin spent a month learning Tibetan and teaching students Putonghua so they could communicate. The farthest town, Bitu, is more than 160 kilometers from the school. In the past, it took students three days to walk to school. "And there was only one teaching building," said Su.

With the help of the government, new roads were built and the school's condition has been improved. Now the government provides the students free traffic service from home to school.

After four periods of construction, the school now has 15 school buildings and a standard playground. More parents have come to realize the importance of education, so the number of students in the school has increased to 1,500.

Due to the long distance from home to school, most students in Xizang can only go home once a term

Teachers at school need to take care of all aspects of their students' lives. "We are not only the students' teachers, but also their parents," said Gan.

Thus, it is a pity that the couple can't stay with their children and parents back in Sichuan. There are fewer than 100 days in a year for them to be together.

But it is because of a group of people like them spending more time with their students instead of their family that education in remote areas can improve

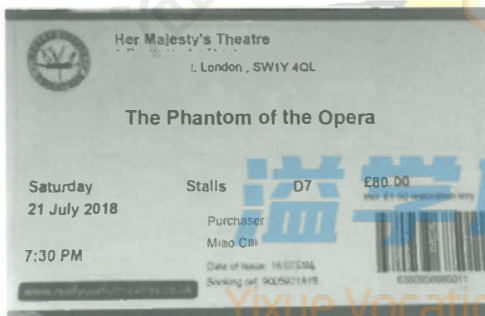

Marie Curie is a famous scientist who is best known for her discovery of two new radioactive (放射性的) elements. During the First World War, Marie Curie played an important part and it is said that her unbelievable invention helped over one million wounded soldiers.

Marie Curie was born in Poland on November 7, 1867. When she grew older, Marie wanted to go to university and study physics. Unfortunately, at that time women were not allowed to study in Poland, so Marie had to move to France where she was allowed to go to university.

After she had completed a degree in physics, Marie worked together with her husband. During this time, Marie discovered two new elements which had never been heard of before. For her amazing discoveries, Marie Curie became the first woman ever to have won a Nobel Prize. A few years later, Marie went on to win a second Nobel Prize.

At the outbreak of the First World War, Marie noticed that wounded soldiers — especially those with broken bones — recovered better if they were treated quickly. She already had a good understanding of radiation and how it was used to take x-rays, so she decided to put this knowledge to good use. Marie created mobile x-ray machines

which could be used on the front line. This meant that soldiers who had been wounded could be treated a lot more quickly. Helped by her 17-year-old daughter, Irene, Marie Curie was able to install 20 mobile x-ray vehicles and 200 x-ray units at field hospitals in the first year of the First World War. These unbelievable machines were named Petites Curie after the amazing lady who created them

At the "Culture + Tourism" area, exhibitors from Japan and Brazil show videos and posters introducing their own countries and cultures to visitors, as well as promote cultural exchanges and other activities to Chinese visitors. Furthermore, some famous tourism producers from Germany and France have been exhibiting their tourism equipment and outdoor products to offer a comfortable travel experience to clients.

Animation (动画) lovers can find many new cartoons, mobile games and animation-related products at the

“Culture + Originality” area. Meanwhile, a lot of technological products and projects, such as VR (虚拟现实) education, fire drill training systems, robots, and etc. are presented in the “Culture + Technology” area.

What’s more, this Expo provides a great opportunity for students to learn about some world-famous universities. During the exhibition, staff from Romania’s Transilvania University are using VR devices to introduce their university. International and local universities in China’s Harbin can attend academic exchanges for the purpose of cooperation and communication during the Expo.



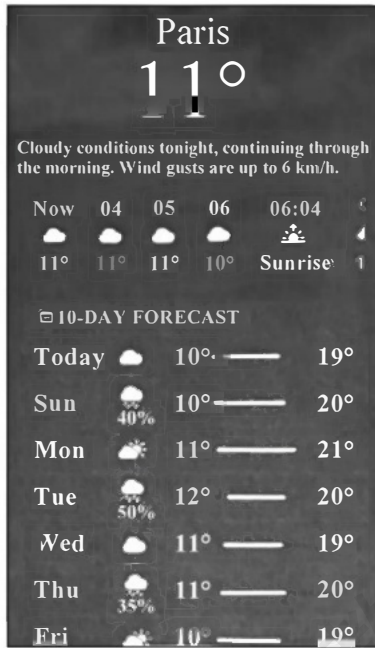

Many people around the world check how many steps they walk every day. This is because studies suggest that 10,000 steps a day is enough to help us stay healthy and live longer. However, new study says just 4,000 steps a day could be the magic number for us to live well into old age. Researchers from the Johns Hopkins University of Medicine analyzed (分析) 17 studies that looked at how far people walked during the week. The scientists found that 4,000 steps a day reduced the risk of dying from diabetes, cardiovascular diseases and other life-threatening conditions. The leading researcher Dr. Martin said 4,000 steps was about a 30- to 45-minute walk, or about three to four kilometers.

The study is published in the European Journal of Preventive Cardiology. The research examined health and exercise data from more than 225,000 adult participants (参与者) worldwide over seven years. They had an average age of 64. Some of them were in good health, while others suffered from heart problems. Dr. Martin found that 4,000 steps was helpful, and that it was a minimum amount. He said, "I wouldn't want people to look at that as a magic number. More is better." He added that walking an additional 1,000 steps a day was linked with a 15 percent lower risk of earlier death. He said people should add at least one walk to their daily routine.
